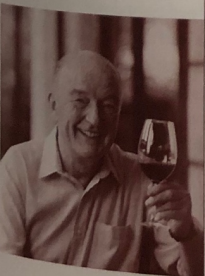
Michael Hill Smith

Michael Hill Smith became Australia's first-ever Master of Wine in 1988. Today, he is also a consultant, international wine judge, vineyard owner and wine producer. Michael has been featured on Decanter Magazine's international power list three times – in 2009, 2011 and 2013. He was awarded the prestigious Order of Australia honour in 2008 for his significant contribution to the Australian wine industry.



Jeannie Cho Lee

Jeannie Cho Lee is the first Asian Master of Wine, and an award-winning author and wine judge. She received the International Vintality Award in 2009 and was named the 25th most powerful person in wine by Decanter Magazine in 2013. As a professor of wine at the Hong Kong Polytechnic University, Jeannie also hosts a popular wine programme in Hong Kong. In addition, she holds a Certificat de Cuisine from Cordon Bleu and is trained as a Master Sake Sommelier.



Oz Clarke

Oz Clarke is a prolific writer who has received all the major wine writing accolades in the UK and US, including the Glenfiddich, Wine Guild and Lanson awards. He has authored many books on wine – including 'Bordeaux', which won the Louis Roederer International Wine Book of the Year award in 2009. Oz also hosts several popular television and radio programmes, in addition to being co-chairman of the International Wine Challenge. In 2010, he was awarded the esteemed Officier de l'Ordre du Mérite Agricole by the French government.

2009 Dom Pérignon, Champagne, France

Champagne, with its famous limestone soils and cold climate, makes the world's greatest sparkling wines. The most famous of them all is Dom Pérignon. DP, as it is affectionally known, is named after the Benedictine monk who pioneered many of the techniques used in Champagne today. Dom Pérignon is always from a single vintage and a blend of Chardonnay and Pinot Noir grapes. Dom Pérignon is overseen by newly appointed Chef de Cave Vincent Chaperon. 2009 was not without its challenges but was a warmer vintage overall, producing a wine that is generous yet shows DP's legendary elegance and finesse. Delicious!

OR

2004 Krug, Champagne, France

Champagne has no peer and Krug is undisputedly one of its greatest names. Founded in 1843 by Joseph Krug, the wines of Krug are seen by many as the ultimate expression of Champagne - effortlessly combining power and intensity with finesse, length and balance. In addition to Chardonnay and Pinot Noir, Krug famously includes a higher percentage of Pinot Meunier in their blends than most other prestige cuvees. Vintage Krug not only reflects the House style but also the character of a specific year and 2004 was an exceptional vintage. A rare champagne of extraordinary quality which has benefited from over 12 years of maturation in the cool cellars of Reims.

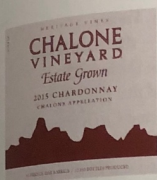
2016 Reichsrat Von Buhl Deidesheimer Herrgottsacker Riesling Kabinett, Pfalz, Germany

The 2016 vintage has made quite a reputation for itself in Germany. After months of rain and frost, suddenly summer broke out and ripened the grapes to perfection. The autumn temperatures then dropped right down, allowing the grapes to keep all their irresistible freshness and perfume. Deidesheim is in Southern Germany, an intensely beautiful village nestled under the dark forests of the Haardt mountains. Our wine is a Riesling from the organic Herrgottsacker vineyard (the name means 'Our Lord's Field') which ripples down to the village's edge. This off-dry Riesling is hauntingly scented with honeysuckle, and a gentle peach fruit drifts across your palate finishing with a light spray of mouthwatering lemon acidity, and it's only 9% alcohol.

2015 Chalone Estate Chardonnay, Monterey County, Central Coast, California, USA

Some of the most complex Chardonnays from California come from the Central Coast with the influence of the Pacific Coast creating white wines that combine intensity with freshness. Chalone has been a pioneer in the Monterey region since the 1890s when the vineyard was first planted by a French man who believed the limestone soil was similar to Burgundy. This Chardonnay expresses its place well – the refreshing acidity reflects the cool Pacific breeze from this site while the juicy nectarine and apricot flavours reveal the region's plentiful sunshine. There is a backbone of minerality and a lingering finish that can be attributed to its unique limestone soils.

2014 Dalrymple Cave Block Chardonnay, Tasmania, Australia

Less than 1% of Australia's wine comes from Tasmania, yet in fine wine terms this island state, with its genuine cold climate, pristine environment and stunning natural beauty, is attracting real excitement and international attention. Dalrymple was established in 1987 in Pipers Brook in the Tamar Valley located north of the island, near the city of Launceston. This wine, made by the passionate and highly competent Peter Caldwell, is a fine example of Tasmanian Chardonnay. It has a restrained and subtle fruit character lightly seasoned by careful oak maturation. A wine with excellent acidity, palate length and flavour intensity, it is a revelation to those unfamiliar with Tasmanian wines.

2008 Château Rauzan-Ségla, Margaux, France

The wines from the village of Margaux are considered among the most scented, supple and intriguing of all the wines of Bordeaux. Château Rauzan-Ségla has for hundreds of years been regarded as one of the village's greatest properties, along with Château Margaux itself. So it made perfect sense when the perfume and fashion house of Chanel bought the vineyard in 1994, with the objective of turning Rauzan-Ségla's wine into a reflection of the scents and glamour which Chanel embodied. 2008 is a highly rated vintage, but one which is only now showing its classic style. Rauzan's mellow fragrance and soothing lush texture suits this vintage perfectly.

2016 Albert Bichot Corton Grand Cru, Burgundy, France

The first traces of the Bichot family date back to 1214 -- the family's coat of arms has not changed since nor has its symbol, a doe (biche). Albert Bichot joined the company in the 90s. He is convinced that good quality wine depends on good quality grapes. This Corton Grand Cru is grown on a vineyard with brown limestone soil overlying very clayey scree in the Côte de Beaune area. 100% Pinot Noir grapes are handpicked and aged in 100% oak barrels. These carefully controlled steps result in a truly quality wine with a subtle mix of smokey notes and spicy aromas with a light touch of liquorice on the nose. Fine and elegant, this robust wine also has a supple structure with harmonious tannins which give way to a long finish intensively flavoured by fruity notes.

2012 Louis Latour Chateau Corton Grancey Grand Cru, Burgundy, France

"Grancey" was the name of the last owners of the chateau situated on the road of Corton, before the Latour family bought it in 1891. This wine, produced by Maison Louis Latour, is unique and exclusive. It is a blend of 4 areas of Domaine Latour Grand Cru: Bressandes, Perriers, Greves and Clos du Roi, the proportions of which vary depending on the vintage. The average age of the vines is over 40 years. After aging individually, only the best barrels are assembled to create the Chateau Corton Grancey. It is a wine that is produced only if the grapes are of a perfect maturity. The Chateau Corton Grancey 2012 is an intense ruby colour. Clean and fresh on the nose, aromas of cassis and liquorice emerge. It is an ample and powerful wine with a slightly linty aftertaste.

2015/2016 Clonakilla O'Riada Shiraz, Canberra District, Australia

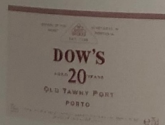
The climate in Canberra is cool and in stark contrast to many other Australian wine regions. Not surprisingly, Shiraz grown here is very different to the wines from warmer regions – medium-bodied and perfumed rather than rich and powerful. Clonakilla is a small family owned winery established in 1971 that has developed an extraordinary reputation for distinctive high quality wines under the guidance of winemaker Tim Kirk. A deep thinker, Kirk is certainly one of the winemaking stars of his generation. Very much in the modern style, this wine has vibrant pepper-spice characters, good acidity and fruit brightness. A quintessential “cool climate” Shiraz.

OR

2015 Sons of Eden Remus Shiraz, Eden Valley, Australia

Sons of Eden is named after winemaker Corey Ryan and viticulturist Simon Cowham, two partners who both learnt and refined their trades in the vineyards and cellars of Eden Valley. Remus is their blend of old-vine Shiraz over 50 years of age from three different sub-regions: Moculta, Keyneton and Central Eden Valley. Matured for 22 months in 55% new oak, the 2015 vintage is deep garnet in colour with an alluring aroma of spicy red current and blackberry fruits, underpinned by dried thyme and bay leaf. The palate is very concentrated, fleshy and well-structured with a refined finish.

Port



Dow's 20 Year Old Port, Douro, Portugal

With twenty years of cask aging, this Port has acquired a gorgeous aroma of dried flowers, toffee, sweet spices and dried figs. The tannins have softened and evolved into a silky texture with subtle, layered flavours that are persistent on the finish. A beautifully balanced Port that can be enjoyed on its own or with cheese or dessert.
